

These cookies were an absolute smash at the last Probus Singers gettogether!

Banana Bread Chocolate Chip Cookies

These cookies are extremely super soft and moist - you've never had a cookie like them before!

2 very ripe (not frozen) mashed bananas - approx 2/3 cup (a bit more won't hurt)

1/2 c. oil

1/2 c. plain yogurt (or use all oil)

1/2 c brown sugar - or 1/2 cup white sugar and 1 Tbsp molasses

2 egg yolks

2 tsp vanilla

2 2/3 c flour (measure lightly)

1 tsp baking soda

4 tsp cinnamon

1/4 tsp salt

1/2-3/4 cup chocolate chips

1 cup coconut - or 1/2 cup and 1/2 cup finely chopped walnuts or other nuts you like

(Other additives if you feel like it - chopped dried cranberries, raisins, mint, caramel, or white chocolate chips.....)

Whisk first 6 ingredients together, add in dry, mix well. Let dough sit for about 1/2 hour for flour to hydrate.

Bake at 350 for 10-12 minutes only until lightly brown on the edges.



schnitzel on the menu. I will know more when I send out the notice next week. Please wait for the notice to come out next week before replying to me about attendance.



"I'd like to be six again", she replied, still looking in the mirror.


