GOLF GROUP

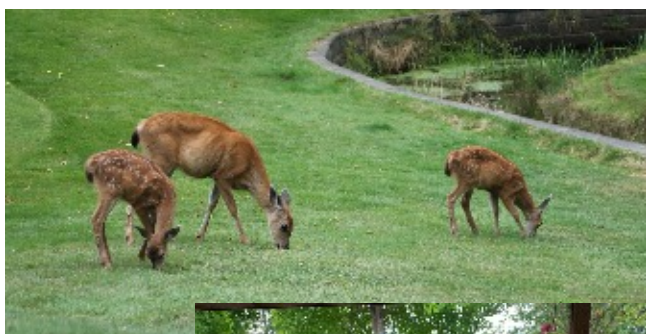
