


Titanic Power


They experienced Mahler's Symphony No. 1 in D Major: "Titan. Plus, an encore performance by our 2023 Concerto Competition winner and runner-up.

As well as the dictionary of "Bookworms" each of our book lovers received their very own and very cute "bookworm". Thank you to Cricket, the smiles lasted for days.


