In recognition of her service and dedication to Orca Probus, Rose Jacobson was presented with an Orca Probus Club Honorary Membership certificate at the November 9th Meeting.

Rose joined Orca Probus in May of 2005. Within 7 months, she had volunteered for the bridge club, co-leading for 2 years. Upon her return to the Valley, she continued as co-leader and then leader, for a total of 9 years. In March 2011, Rose also organized the first bowling activity for the club. At the Orca Probus 10-year Anniversary, Rose was an integral part of the entertainment committee, and participated in numerous other performances for the enjoyment of Probus members. She was an enthusiastic participant in the Probus Singers, enjoyed Probus Curling, and was an avid Probus Golfer. She was the first to sign up for the annual “Paddles Up With Probus” Dragon Boating, and one of the first on board again in 2018 at 98 years young!

Our September 2005 Probus newsletter congratulated Rose, who represented the Comox Valley at the BC Senior Games (swimming), bringing home 5 gold medals, 2 silver, and 1 bronze.

Rose’s dedication and service started well before Probus. Cpl. Rose Jacobson served in WWII for 3 years, training young pilots in Morse, Aldis, Signal, Lamp, and Flag codes.

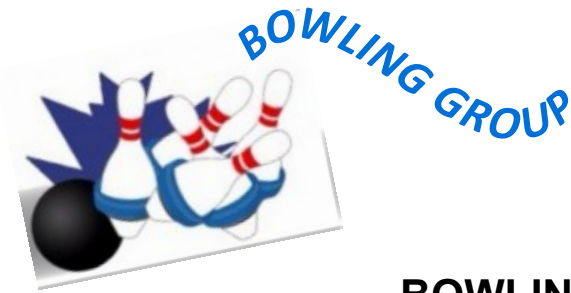
PHONE SCAMS
